SCiP Alliance practice hub framework

The framework was accepted by the group, with some suggestions for the central practice group to consider:

- Plot timescales so hub meetings take place after central practice group/steering group meetings.
- Meetings should also take into account HE timescales eg. Before deadlines for access agreements.
- The central practice group should send key messages to group to disseminate and discuss.
- In return, someone in the group should report back to the central practice group any key discussion points from the regional meeting.
- The regional hub should have a @scipalliance.org email address and its own tab/section on the website where anyone can download minutes from regional meetings and find links to local organisations.
- Stakeholder consultations should also be timed after regional meetings.

Discussion Breakout

The discussion moved away from the discussion points on the agenda, but focused more on how we can do more work to actively engage schools. The following points were made:

- We should look at what progression is like in rural areas, where they don't have a university on their doorstep.
- Identifying service children in schools is dependent on parents telling the school that they are service family. Info collection isn't consistent and parents sometimes don't tell schools.
- It would be interesting to know what questions are being asked during the admissions process
- One big issue is that schools don't know that it is an issue that Service Children don't go on to University/HE.
- MJ noted that most secondary schools in York have 5 15 students which are small numbers. To convince then, he suggested the schools would like having a document that offers support.
- The SCiP Alliance need to make the website more accessible to primary and secondary school teachers – eg. What can they get out of it and why should they use it.
- After the SCiP/SCISS stakeholder consultation could the answers be distilled into a flyer which schools can read?
- It was also suggested that we ask the research group to create a report that shows regional picture, including breakdown by rank.

Future Meetings

The group is considering holding future meetings in schools to encourage school participation.
