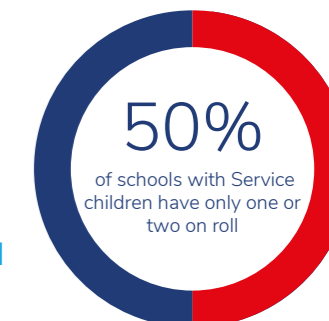

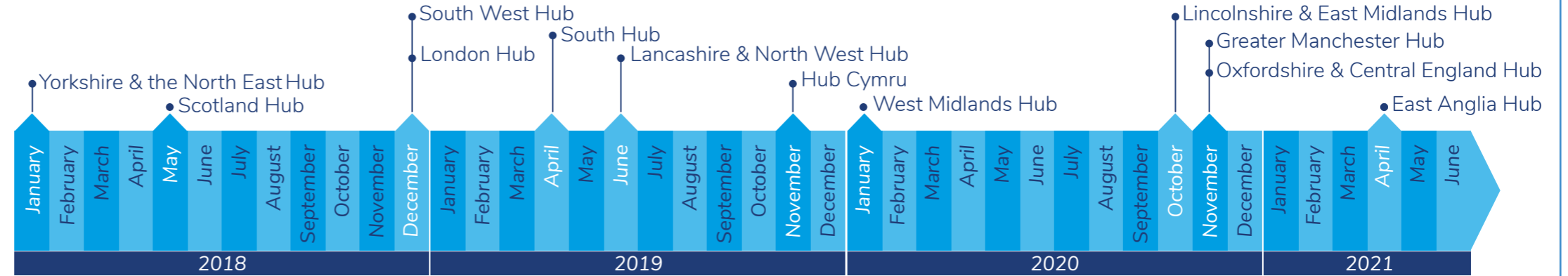

GROWTH OF CREATIVE FORCES COLLABORATIVE HE OUTREACH EVENTS

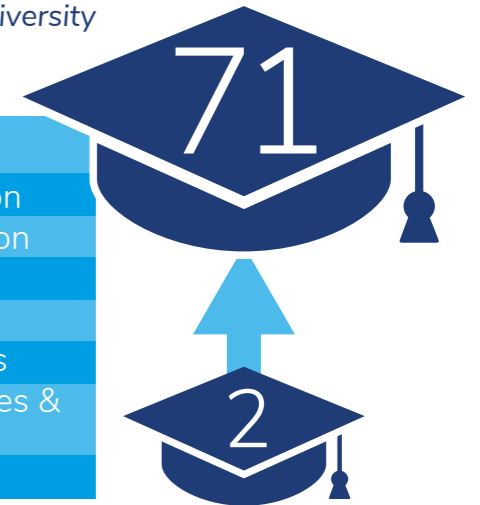

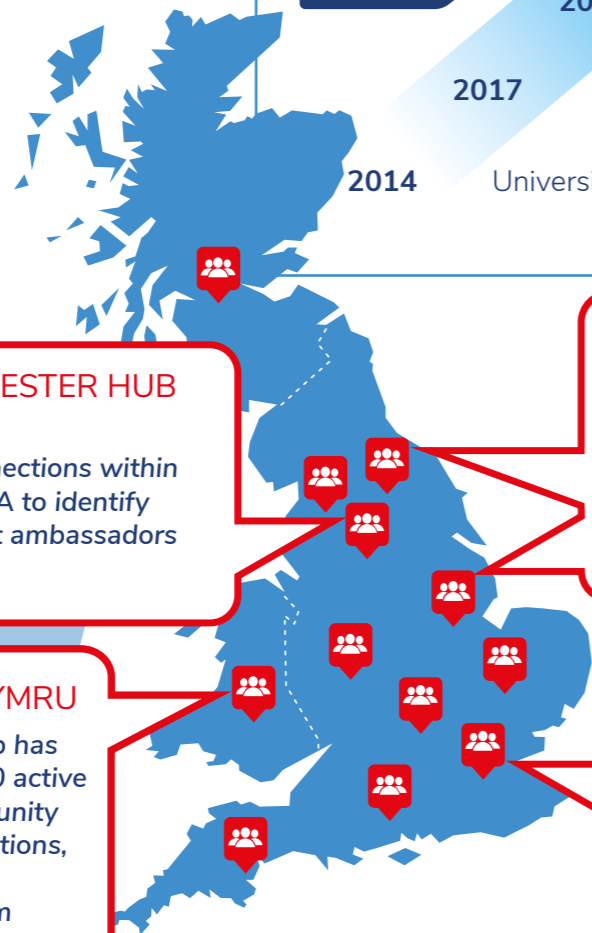

12 HUBS ACROSS THE UK

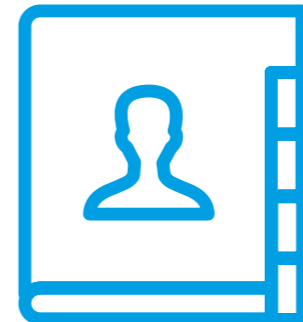


GREATER MANCHESTER HUB
