- Secure productive two-way engagement with policy and practice stakeholders including government, education and third sector organisations, to enable the meaningful application of robust research to policy and practice.





Activities

Project: A feasibility study of mainstream education regimes and their support for the processes of decision-making regarding post-16 education in respect of the needs of Army children.

Lead investigator: Dr Amy Warhurst

Anticipated outcomes: Identification of themes, factors, perspectives etc surrounding children's decision-making processes

Timescale: Q3-Q4 2017





Activities

Project: Further refinement of the data set on children from military service families

Lead investigator: Dr Judith McCullouch

Anticipated outcomes: Development of a more accurate estimate of the participation of young people from military service families in higher education

Timescale: Ongoing





Activities

Project: A PhD studentship investigating the educational progression of children from military service families.

Proposals from most disciplinary background, theoretical frameworks and methodologies will be considered, and cross-disciplinary research will be welcomed.

Timescale: Commencing October 2017








Geographical distribution of children (ages 16-19) of service personnel


